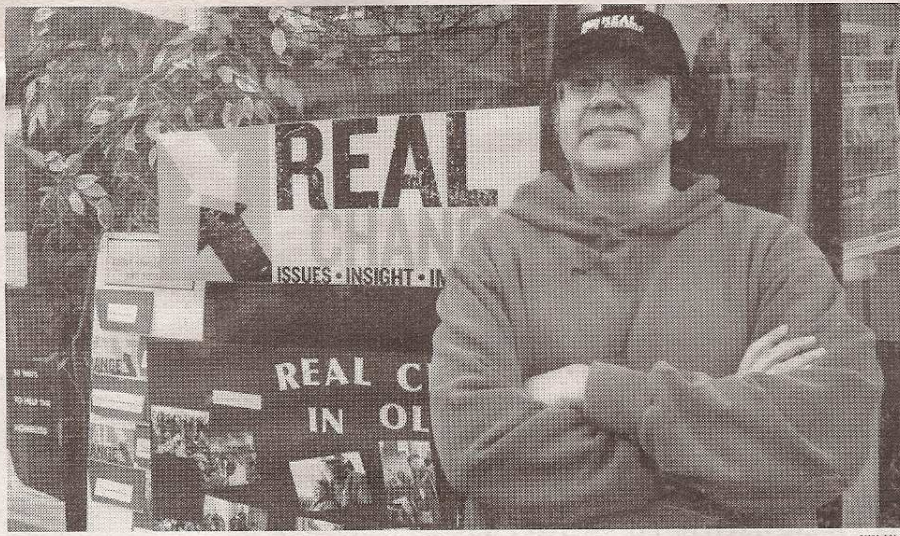

NORTH AND EAST CITIES MOVE REGIONAL JAIL SOLUTION FORWARD
Six sites identified for further environmental study

SEATTLE – The North/East Cities (NEC) municipal jail planning group announced today its intent to move forward with environmental review and public comment of six potential sites for a new regional misdemeanor jail, including working with King County to evaluate the development of an annex to the county jail in downtown Seattle. This is part of an ongoing, comprehensive process as the cities plan for a single 640-bed municipal jail facility to replace the jail beds they are losing in King County. The NEC is composed of 23 cities, including Redmond, Seattle and Shoreline.

Three of the potential sites are unincorporated King County sites:
 • King County Jail Annex
 • Fifth Avenue and Jefferson
 • 1600 W. Armory Way
 • Park Way S.W. & West Marginal Way
